Wetland Wildlife Area

The plan to revitalise the wetland area is moving towards its next stage - getting approval from the Environment Agency (as the area falls within the park flood zone) and addressing any Health and Safety concerns.



We've set out our vision for an area which provides a watery habitat for a wide range of species and encourages people to enjoy what it offers. As it includes open water it will have to be fenced, but it includes a viewing platform and information boards to open it up to park users. Park Work Volunteering

We continue to see new volunteers joining us as people move to Tod or their work patterns change. Teenagers from Compass Community School have also been coming regularly to our Thursday sessions. We're working hard to keep on top of invasive plants, like the Himalayan Balsam we've been removing from the park boundary behind the cricket club. We've planted more herbs in the fruit garden near the park depot and there will be lots of red and blackcurrants to pick over the coming weeks. Volunteers from Ridge Consulting are hoping to join us again at one of the sessions after a successful session in April with CMBC staff volunteers. They repainted the benches in the Memorial Garden (see below), as well as clearing the cobbled path through the woods. Temporary School on the Meadow

We know many of you wrote to **CMBC** consultants Avison Young about your concerns and objections to the proposal. The issues raised have delayed the intended timeline and CMBC have now separated what was a joint planning application for the rebuild of Castle Hill school and the temporary site on the meadow - the planning application for the Castle Hill school has gone in. To date we understand CMBC is still intent on the plan to locate the temporary school on the meadow and still completing the planning application.

FoCVP continues to communicate with relevant organisations, in particular Fields In Trust.

We will let you know when the planning application goes in so you can express your views.

Town Deal Park Improvements Update

<u>ACTIVE TODMORDEN Cycle Route:</u> following on from consultation and questionnaires - entering the park from the Burnley Road, the curved route has been chosen and would wind its way around to the tennis courts - with new lighting along the whole route.

<u>MUGA</u>: The location and plausibility of the MUGA is still in discussion - the hope is to locate it where the outdoor gym exists - which would be relocated within the park.

<u>Bandstand</u>: lease transfer from Calderdale to Todmorden Town Council is in progress and the planning application has gone in.

<u>Tennis Courts</u>: the drainage issues have been resolved and the three courts should be go ahead.



<u>Bowling Pavilion</u>: revised plans with extended exterior space can be seen on the website.
