Picnic in the Park 2023.... Town Deal Funded Park Developments



Above is an Edwardian bandstand. If not ours, then very similar in design. Todmorden Town Council has been awarded £250.000 towards the restoration of the bandstand, to add to the £1.1 m already agreed as part of the Town Deal money. This means work can go ahead to restore it to its former glory. Excellent news!

Congratulations to the Bandstand Group and all who have been working hard to make this happen! Buttress Architects will do the work to restore the Grade 2 Listed bandstand and improve its security and functionality They will work with Todmorden High School pupils to encourage an interest in Heritage Construction, providing 5 work placements, and they're planning a Heritage Time Line for Todmorden within the park.

Bowling Pavilion - The tender for extending the Bowling Pavilion is out and grant money applied for, to make up the shortfall in funding needed. The grant bodies would respond well to evidence of public interest and support for the project, in which if successful, may provide facilities for a number of groups in addition to the Bowling Club, which may include Todmorden in Bloom, Friends of Centre Vale Park, Todmorden Veterans Association, the Cadets, and the Tennis Club. Productive Meeting with Calderdale Council

Focup Chair Karen Andrews and Secretary Bob Still met with Jonathan Cole, Corporate Lead for Greenspaces and Andrew Pitts, Assistant Director of Neighbourhoods for CMBC. It's proposed that regular Park Walkabouts be resumed, and Quarterly Meetings with relevant key CMBC staff be held with Focup to check progress. Both parties will agree a Partnership Agreement so that clarity about how we work together can be achieved, and become more effective.

The woodland work that FoCVP has undertaken with the guidance, expertise and input of Committee Member Philip Marshall, and the co-ordination and leadership of Rachel Terry, has been acknowledged as a worthwhile and valuable contribution by CMBC who will in future, we hope, ensure the Views and work of FoCVP will be considered in the woodland management of the park.

Exciting New Project in the Wetland



You may well have noticed just how wet the park's designated 'wetland area' is at present. The fence that supposedly surrounds it currently traverses a lake. An exciting new project aims to improve the area for people and wildlife, opening it up to the park's visitors and

making it a thriving wildlife habitat all year round. Our current wish list includes a boardwalk, viewing platform, ponds, info boards, and a feeding station for birds in winter.
