Meetings with Calderdale Council

Our Chair Karen, joined by one other committee member, convenes quarterly meetings with senior officers of Calderdale Council. The meetings last an hour with agenda and minutes. Collaboratively working with the officers, numerous issues are raised on behalf of the Friends - we hold them to account where they need prompting to stick to promises, or act in a more consultative way. One recent action is to let you know the public toilets at the main entrance are being refurbished during February.



Memorial Donation Policy

You might have noticed several benches being removed from the park - though sometimes beyond repair, one has recently been restored and returned. Some benches are through memorial donation - the standard cost for Calderdale Council to supply and install a bench with memorial plaque is £1,236 plus VAT. The plaque inscriptions must be under forty words and suitable for public display. Maintenance is provided for 10 years - be in touch if you want a copy of the Council's latest policy.
